### Evaluation Process

Purpose: The Evaluation Process provides a method of assessing players' skills which is the framework used for assembling competitive teams within the U10, U12A2 and U12A3 loops.

Evaluation Committee: The Evaluation Committee is made up of a Convenor, a Coordinator and one other Macdonald Ringette Board Member. The Board will assign these positions annually. The Convenor will schedule ice, communicate with players and parents and participate in team formation; the Coordinator will select and coach evaluators and participate in team formation; the other Committee Member will assist the Convenor, Coordinator and participate in team formation.

Registration and Fees: Players are asked to arrive at the rink at least 45 minutes prior to the evaluation in order to register their attendance. The Evaluation Skate is mandatory and, therefore, there is no fee for attending.

Interaction with Evaluators: Players, Parents, Coaches or others are not permitted to be present within the section reserved for Evaluators, nor should they approach or otherwise communicate with the Evaluators during the evaluation process.

Injured or Absent Players: Players unable to attend the evaluation skate, must provide to the Convenor notice in writing before the commencement of the session. In this case, the Convenor will in its discretion, use the prior year's information in ranking the player.

Results: The evaluation process is general in nature; results are, therefore, not made available.

Team Formation: The data collected through the evaluation process and the recommendations from the Board will be adopted by the Evaluation Committee when determining how teams will be formed.

Team Size: Team size will be determined annually by the Board based on number of players being evaluated and the discretion of the Evaluation Committee.

Notice: Once rosters have been established players will be notified by their coach/manager of their team.

Mutual Respect: Everyone is reminded that although team formation can be a stressful part of the season, a mutual respect for the athletes, coaches, volunteers, evaluators, officials and parents is required at all times.
